Unit 4	Year 1	Round and Round
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Knowledge – What I will know at the end of the unit.	Vocabulary
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Sing: To confidently sing songs from memory and sing them in unison.
Play: To know the names of some of the notes in an instrumental part from memory or when written down.
Improvise: To know that everyone can improvise!
Compose: To know that everyone can compose.
Perform: To know that a performance is sharing music with other people, called an audience



- **Audience** – the people who listen to a performance.
- **Bass guitar**

- **Compose** – create a musical idea.
- **Improvise** – to make up a tune and play it on the spot.
- **Keyboard**


Activities

- **Find the pulse!**
 - Use your imagination to find the pulse!
- **Clapping Rhythms**
 - Clap the rhythm of your name
 - Clap the rhythm of your favourite animal
 - Make up your own rhythms
- **Singing**
 - The song Round and Round
- **Playing instruments**
 - Use one or two notes – C or C + D.
- **Improvise**
 - Use the notes C + D
- **Compose**
 - Use simple rhythms, choosing from the notes C + D or C, D + E.
- **Perform**
 - A class performance of In The Groove – with singing and playing

- **Perform** – sing and play instruments for others to hear.
- **Percussion** – instruments played by hitting or shaking them.
- **Pitch** – how high or low a sound is.
- **Pulse** – the heartbeat or steady beat of a song/piece of music.
- **Rhythm** – the mix of long and short sounds to make patterns.
- **Saxophone**

- **Trumpet**


Skills

- **Sing:** Sing notes of different pitches (high and low).
 - **Play:** Play a tuned instrumental part with the song they perform.
 - **Improvise:** Use voices and instruments, listen and sing back, then listen and play your own answer using one or two notes.
 - **Compose:** Create a simple melody using one, two or three notes.
 - **Perform:** Record a performance and say how you were feeling about it.
