| Pablo Picasso 1881-1973 <br> Picasso was a Spanish artist who lived in Paris, France. He was brilliant at drawing. He loved to experiment with colour. He had times where he first made lots of sad, blue paintings followed by lots of happier paintings using warmer colours. <br> He invented Cubism. <br> Cubism <br> In Cubist artwork, the artist breaks an object into different shapes. The paintings are not realistic. <br> Paul Klee 1879-1940 <br> Klee focused on using colour. He often painted a watercolour background and then created a simple line drawing on top. <br> Andy Warhol 1928-1987 <br> Warhol was a famous American pop artist.
