- Find the pulse!
 - March in time with the pulse

- Clapping Rhythms
 - Copy and clap back rhythms
 - Clap the rhythm of your name
 - Make up your own rhythm
- Singing
 - o Rap and sing Hey You! in groups
- Playing instruments
 - Using one or two notes C or C + G.
- Improvise
 - Using the notes C + G
- Compose
 - A simple melody using simple rhythms, choosing from the notes C + D
- Perform
 - A class performance of Hey You! –
 With rapping, singing and playing.

- Vocabulary
 - Bass the low sounds in music.
 - Compose create a musical idea
 - Decks equipment used by DJs, MCs, and Rappers to mix sounds from different records and to make effects.
 - Drums

- Improvise to make up a tune and play it on the spot.
- **Melody** a group of notes played one after the other.
- Perform sing and play instruments for others to hear.
- Pitch how high or low a sound is.
- Pulse the heartbeat or steady beat of a song/piece of music.
- Rap speaking in time to the music.
- Rhythm the mix of long and short sounds to make patterns.

Skills

- **Sing:** Make different types of sounds with your voice Rap or say words in rhythm.
- Play: Treat instruments carefully and with respect.
- **Improvise:** Listen and clap back, then listen and clap your own answer (rhythms of words).
- **Compose:** Help to create a simple melody using one or two notes.
- **Perform:** Add your ideas to a performance.
