
Knowledge

Vocabulary

- Cloud a white or grey mass of fine drops of water or ice high in the sky.
- Lightning natural electricity produced in thunderclouds. Lightning appears as a bright flash or streak of light in the sky.
- Rain drops of water that form in the clouds and fall from the sky
- Season one of 4 divisions of the year often marked by different weather patterns.
- Snow soft, white flakes of ice that fall from the sky to the earth. Snow is formed when water in the upper air freezes into crystals.
- Storm a violent disturbance in the atmosphere that brings rain, snow, wind, thunder, or lightning.
- Sun a spinning ball of hot, glowing gas that provides heat and light to all the planets in the solar system, including Earth.
- Temperature how hot or cold something is.
- Thunder the loud cracking noise or low distant rumble that follows a flash of lightning.
- Wind the movement of air as it moves over the surface of the Earth.
