

Each country has a capital city: England (London) Scotland (Edinburgh) Wales (Cardiff) Northern Ireland (Belfast)</p> <p>Europe is one of the 7 continents.</p>		<p>Vocabulary</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • City - a large town that contains houses, shops and factories. • Compass - a tool used to show directions. • Grid Reference - a map reference that indicates a particular location in terms of a series of vertical and horizontal grid lines identified by numbers or letters. • Key - something that provides an explanation. • Map - the aerial view of a place. • Ordnance Survey Map - a detailed map. • Standard Symbol - an agreed sign that represents something.
<p>New Knowledge</p> <p>Cities of the united Kingdom include: Aberdeen, Glasgow, Newcastle upon Tyne, Leeds, Nottingham, Norwich, Southampton, Bristol, Swansea, Liverpool, Manchester and Londonderry.</p> <p>There are 44 countries in Europe, including the United Kingdom.</p> <p>There are 8 points of a compass.</p>
