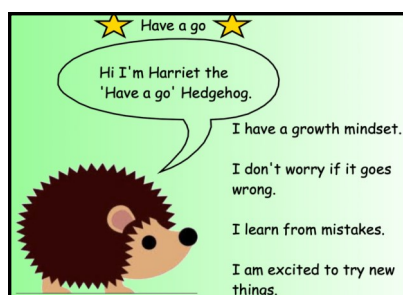

Year 2

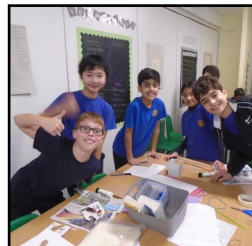

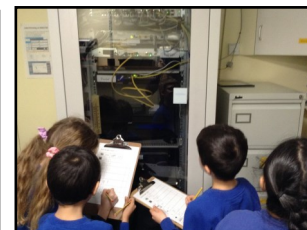
Year 6

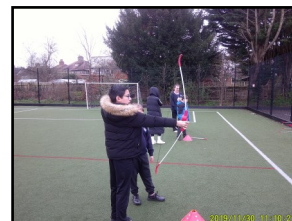
Red Nose Day
